CIC Overview

The Changemakers Innovation Challenge was conceived by ACT Foundation as a response to the impressive work of community non-profits and social enterprises in Africa that leverage technology and digital tools to create social change within their communities. Whether it be solutions in mobile health, farm automation, telemedicine, ed-tech, microfinance, and beyond, technological advancements continue to strengthen the capacity of organizations to solve social problems. Emerging technological innovations like artificial intelligence, data analytics, blockchain, renewable energy sources, and other transformative solutions also play a pivotal role in driving social change. In response to these trends, ACT Foundation seeks to garner partnerships towards the support of such forward-thinking organizations and innovators in creating lasting impact.

The Challenge has supported 19 social enterprises with funding and technical assistance, enabling them to scale innovations ranging from tech-enabled blood drives and academic learning platforms to sustainable agriculture, business development and renewable energy solutions for underserved communities.

The theme for this year is 'Innovation in Action: Youth Rising for Change,' focusing on providing grant funding and technical support to African Changemakers aged 18-25 that are utilizing technological and digital tools to develop innovative social solutions

Grant funding will be awarded to the top three (4) finalists of the Changemakers Innovation Challenge, facilitating the scaling of their innovative solutions across different communities. Winners will be announced at the 8th Breakfast Dialogue.

Solarpeer 360, Nigeria

SolarPeer 360 uses a Smart Solar Energy System that combines innovation, efficiency, and security for sustainable power management. Its Smart Solar Tracking System automatically adjusts panels for optimal sunlight capture, while an Energy Sharing algorithm enables remote energy control and fair distribution among tenants. Sensor-Based Monitoring transmits real-time performance data to a cloud dashboard for transparency. An Intrusion Detection feature with IR sensors sends instant WhatsApp alerts for security.



Clinton Adoga

Farmlens, Kenya

Farmlens uses technology to help smallholder farmers adapt to climate change. They are developing an autonomous Spider Bot that uses sensors and AI to monitor soil health in real time. Alongside this, Agri Core Sensor Hubs will track key soil and environmental data, while Climate-Smart Maps visualise trends like rainfall and degradation. All this information is delivered through a simple digital dashboard or mobile app, helping farmers make better decisions on irrigation, planting, and fertilisation.

NeoNest uses a microcontroller with dual thermistor sensors to keep newborns at 36.5-37.5°C via a low-voltage resistive heater. A thermally insulated shell made from locally sourced, repurposed jerrycans reduces cost and improves durability. A rechargeable lithium-ion pack delivers up to six hours, with 12V ambulance charging. Visual/audio alerts signal temperature drift or low battery.

Cleanup, Nigeria

Cleanup MDC leverages voice technology to make waste reporting and recycling accessible to everyone. By calling a toll-free number in English, Hausa, Yoruba, Igbo, or Pidgin, users can report waste, learn how to sort recyclables, and even earn rewards – no smartphone or internet required. The system uses voice recognition and location data to connect callers to the nearest recycling facility or collection agent for quick, localised response.

Zerobionic's platform uses advanced Natural Language Processing and Automatic Speech Recognition to transcribe spoken content in real time. This data is sent to a 3D-printed robot equipped with servomotors and jointed actuators, enabling it to replicate human sign language movements accurately. The robot's computer vision-guided facial modules reproduce facial expressions for sign interpretation. An edge AI-optimized exoskeleton allows local processing without continuous internet access.

Smokeless Briqs combines IoT data tracking with TEG clean-tech to create a solution that delivers affordable, sustainable cooking energy while improving access to electricity in underserved communities.

YucaChain is a digital innovation transforming Nigeria's cassava value chain through a scalable web and mobile platform. It offers a digital marketplace where stakeholders can list, buy, and sell cassava products, supported by data analytics dashboards powered by Python for demand forecasting, price trends, and production insights. The platform enhances logistics efficiency through API integrations for delivery booking, tracking, and mapping. To improve user experience, YucaChain integrates an AI-powered chatbot using natural language processing (NLP) to answer questions, provide advisory support, and deliver personalised recommendations within the app.
